From Pastor Bill's "Powerbook"



Valentine's Day is about here! About love and love. But, the love God has given us in Jesus Christ and the loving guidance God gives each of us.

We have had wonderful results for our Capital Campaign for "A Place of Our Own;" nearly \$90,000.00 pledged over three years! Thank you all! But, as we make this move we all have to pledge or tithe for our 2009-operating budget as well. Session is proposing a 10% increase for 2009 in order to meet all our increased operating costs, including salaries as well as the need for us to find and call a permanent pastor ... not just an interim. As you read this, please prayerfully consider increasing your pledge or tithe to Palm Springs Presbyterian by at least 10%.

One other thing: I know one of the temptations when making a Capital Fund Pledge is to subtract it from our regular pledge or tithe. We sometimes do this for special mission giving such as the Christmas Joy Offering or the One Great Hour of Sharing. Please do not do this! The "A Place of Our Own" and special mission offerings are to be "Over and Above Giving." At this time, as we make this move, we need more than ever to maintain and increase our giving including all the special offerings we make available, especially in these rather uncertain economic times. Certainly Joyce and I have done this all of our adult lives and continue to do this on a regular basis.

As I write this, we are moving closer and closer to moving into our own new church. Still much to do: finish all the escrow legalities; get a piano and P.A. system and Power-Point; remodel the kitchen and even the pastor's office, obtaining tables and chairs and stoves and refrigerators, etc., get the yard in shape and do whatever repair and correction work needed. Let's make the church glow and invite all to worship and work with us. Session is working long and hard in prioritizing all of these needs and any help or ideas you have will be deeply welcome and appreciated. In fact, all Session members have been assigned and/or volunteered to take on specific responsibilities; but before any actions takes place, or work done, all items will be brought before the Session of prioritizing and approval. But, I believe, we will be in our new church before the end of February - in time for the Women's Retreat in March and in plenty of time for Easter. Won't that be a celebration!!

Many, if not most of us, never thought this would happen in our life times; but God intervenes, works and surprises us ... and this, I believe, is a clear demonstration of God at work! Let us give God all the glory, honor, praise and thanksgiving for this new start and opportunities for PSPC.

Let's not let God or our community down! This will take every one of us pulling together. Joyce and I are going to escape for a few days in the middle of February for our Anniversary; more on that later ... maybe, but not in much detail!!

Look elsewhere in the **SONSHINE** for announcements about the "5:59 Gathering," which will meet on Thursday, February 5th & 19th and again on March 5th & 19th for some interesting insights to what is happening in the Christian world; the Women's Bible Study on Luke, led by Joyce Johnson, continues on Tuesdays, at 9:30 am in the Fellowship Hall; the Men's Bible Study, also on Luke, with Allen Perrier continuing on Wednesday at 7:00 am.

One last thought: If you have not yet given a gift or made a pledge for the "A Place of Our Own," I urge you to do so as soon as possible. I am convinced that it is important for all of us to support prayerfully, financially, and physically, our move toward "A Place of Our Own" and help make this a reality for PSPC after 20+ years of renting and wandering.

A Time to Take Stock:

What is Your Prayer for PSPC? How willing are you to Help Make That Happen? God Has and is Blessing Us; Will you and I Bring God's Love and Grace to Our Community and World? In What Ways Will God Honor Our Efforts and Will We Grow?



Ash Wednesday is a time for repentance and the beginning of Lent. Ashes were used in ancient times, according to the Bible, to express penitence. Dusting themselves with ashes was the penitent's way of expressing sorrow for sins and faults. An ancient example of one expressing his penitence is found in Job 42:3-5. Job says to God: "I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes" (v. 5, NRSV).



Lent is the fourth season of the Christian year. Its length is the 40 days preceding Easter Day, not counting Sundays. This means Lent always begins on a Wednesday, known as Ash Wednesday.

Lent commemorates Jesus' fast and temptation in the wilderness of Judea Province, which, according to the Gospel, lasted 40 days. Just as Jesus confronted his temptations during these 40 days, Lent helps Christians focus on our most basic need as sinners: forgiveness.

The only way our Lord's forgiving power can become effective in our lives is by our taking the initiative to confront our sins, confess them and repent of them. In short, Lent is a season of penitence.

Some Christians fast during Lent. This denial of bodily comforts can help encourage self-reflection about the need for Jesus' forgiveness.

Lord of heaven and earth, we offer you our deepest appreciation for this blessed land. Stir up a sense of stewardship in every citizen so we all may care for our national and each inhabitant of it.

We pray especially for our leaders. Prompt everyone in a position of authority, from local to national leaders, to strive for righteousness, justice and the welfare of all citizens.

Finally, we pray that we may be ever mindful of the psalmist's teaching that "Happy is the nation who's God is the Lord ..." (Psalm 33:12, NRSV). May that promise become real "from sea to shining sea." Amen.

The Presbytery of Philadelphia is bringing the grace of Jesus Christ into the heart of the city through "a different kind of faith community" know as Broad Street Ministries (BSM). A number of congregations pool their resources to support it. BSM attracts a growing community of artists, scholars, intellectuals, blue-collar workers, city workers, and the poor and homeless. They come together Wednesday evenings in "No Holds Barred Bible Studies" where those who are searching for meaning engage deeply with Scripture and with each other; and "No Barriers Dinners," where the mayor of Philadelphia and a seminary professor may sit at a meal with a mother on welfare and a man who lost his toes to the cold while living on the streets. From Jackie Morgan's Kitchen BANANA CAKE

1 c banana pulp, mashed

 $1 \frac{1}{2} c cake flour$

1/4 tsp. salt

1 tsp. vanilla

Ingredients:

1/2 c butter, softened 1 1/4 c sugar

- 2 eggs (lightly beaten)
- 1 tsp. soda
- 4 tbs. sour cream or plain yogurt
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 deg.
- 2. Cream butter and sugar; add eggs. Add the soda, dissolved in the sour cream or yogurt. Beat well; then add the bananas, flour salt and vanilla. Mix well.

Bake in well-greased and floured 8-inch square or 9-inch tube pan for 35 to 45 minutes.


