From Pastor Bill's "Powerbook"



Even more to celebrate than moving into "A Place of Our Own" is the celebration of **Easter!** The resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ and all that means for humanity. **Easter Sunday, April 12th** will be a grand celebration and time of worship at Palm Springs Presbyterian Church - 815 S. Camino Real @ S. Riverside...just off Sunrise near Mesquite @ 10:00 a.m. Bring family and friends, neighbors and strangers. Looking over my life, what a difference my faith in the resurrected Jesus has made; I sometimes wonder what I would have done or been without that faith commitment. What about you?

We have read over and over in John 3:16 that " God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that whoever believes in him will never die, but have everlasting life." What a promise and, I believe, one that we take too easily for granted. 'Believe" in Greek basically means, "to trust..." How much do you and I trust God who loves us to the ninth degree? Do we trust God not only with our lives (of course we do!) but do we also trust God with our money, our energy, our pride, our time and talents? Do we trust God enough to take risks for him and for the Church, the Body of Christ? I cannot imagine living this life without faith in what God has promised even when I do not understand or comprehend it fully ...or even partially. Faith: *stepping out wrapped in God's hands; that is my life.*

For me, as your "Interim" Pastor, I am convinced God has given PSPC new life and hope and vision. All you and I have to do is realize it and put it to work.

Our next "5:59 Gathering" - which will meet on Thursday, April 9th for Maundy Thursday will be dinner and then worship: Communion and my great love, **the Tenebrae**, which means "shadows" and is a recalling of Jesus being deserted by all he loves. Save the date and plan on participating. It will be a sad but joyous time together with our Lord at his Table.

And the Women's Retreat: I have heard nothing but accolades and praises about the retreat, it's planning, and its leadership. It is truly a gift to the women of the church especially in our new church. So many thanks to the Retreat *Committee* for such an outstanding job. We are truly

blessed. Thank you all.

Resurrection Means Reconciliation

Jesus' resurrection is the very foundation of Christianity. If Christ had never been raised from the dead, we'd have no Christian religion.

God's power was at work in Christ's death and resurrection. "It was the resurrection fact that the church was built, "said New Testament scholar James Stewart.

Paul understood that the resurrection was the bedrock of our Christian faith. "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain," he wrote to the Corinthian church (I Corinthians 15:14, NRSV). The apostle went on to say, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (verse 17).

The resurrection proves that Jesus is Lord and Savior. Its authenticity means that by faith in Christ, we are reconciled with God.

Billy Graham said the risen Christ is the bridge between God and us. "One of Christ's hands hold the hand of God; his other hand holds ours," said the evangelist.

History's Darkest Day and Brightest Day

A professor once asked a young man studying for the ministry what the cross of Christ meant to him. The student said, "Well, the cruel death of God's Son, Jesus, was the most soul-shocking event imaginable. What could have been more heartless and evil than the crucifixion of Christ, the most holy person who ever lived?" "That had to be the darkest day in human history".

"On the other hand, one has to consider what happened on the Sunday after his death on Friday. It is quite clear from eyewitness accounts that he arose from the dead and was recognized by his friends as the one they had called Lord. The Resurrection was such a soul-stirring and momentous event that the first Easter Sunday had to be the brightest and most joyous day in the history of the world."

When he had finished, the professor said to him, "That is an excellent interpretation of the meaning of the cross. It was indeed a dark and hideous day when Christ was crucified. Yet that cross took on the symbol of salvation and hope when God raised Christ from the dead. Yes, Christians could say it was the brightest day in history



Maundy Thursday

What is Maundy Thursday, the Thursday of Holy Week all about? The word "Maundy" is a shortened version of the Latin work mandatum, which means commandment.

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his friends a new commandment. He told the disciples, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another" (John 13:34, NRSV).

As Christians gather to eat and share Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday, we should make a special effort to exhibit our love and respect for one another. Let us seek out people whom we don't naturally have affection for and express our wish that the living Christ may dwell in them and bless them.

MINT COOKIES


1 box Nilla wafers1 pkg. Mint cookiesRed food coloringYellow food coloring

1 carton white frosting

Divide frosting into 3 sections (put into separate bowls). Add red coloring to one bowl add yellow food coloring to the second bowl and leave the third bowl white. On waxed paper, spread Nilla wafers, flat side down. On top of wafer, add white frosting and mint cookie, then drizzled red frosting on mint cookie. The add the yellow; add another wafer, round side up, on top of the frosting. Now you have a hamburger! Repeat as however many cookies desired.
