"But, in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died....Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." (II Corin. 15:20; 58 nrsv)

HOW CRUCIAL IS THE RESURRECTION?

We cherish the birth of Jesus, his wisdom, his loving deeds, his courage in the face of a brutal death, but it is Christ's resurrection, which is absolutely crucial to Christian beliefs.

In his first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul explained that the Resurrection was the foundation of our Christian belief system. He insisted that if Christ had not been raised from the dead, then we who believe in eternal life have no hope for it at all. "If the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:16-17, NRSV).

Finally, Paul expresses very clearly how critical the Resurrection is to our Christian hope. "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied" (1 Corinthians 15:19, NRSV).



At first glance, Good Friday appears to be a misnomer. It seems inconsistent that the day of Christ's crucifixion should in any way be described as "good." But that seeming inconsistency vanishes when we understand that the ancient meaning of good was "holy." The word holy is entirely consistent with the suffering and cross that Christ endured for us. Hence, Good Friday is also known as Holy Friday.

Our Women's Retreat was held Sat. March 20th as the second blessed event in our new Church home and the 18th annual Women's Retreat for our church body! What a special day it was, with over 44 ladies congregating in spiritual songs and renewal, led by REV. PATRICIA STOUT and based on Psalm 96:1, 98 and 100. Gail Jones, co-chair, and Ellie Cushing our treasurer, greeted the participants at the church entrance passing out programs and complimentary materials.

Our theme, "Sing a New Song" began with welcome and prayer, led by Co-Chair Sue Cooper, followed by Scripture reading of Psalm 98 by Barbara Stephens, Marilyn K. Walker, honored us with a recitation of one of her acclaimed poems (modified for the occasion) called "SONG IN MY HEART"

Geri Bintliff, our music director, accompanied by Peggy Alexander, led us in a beautiful songfest of inspirational hymns preceding our speaker Rev. Patricia Stout of Twenty-nine Palms.

I have recently had the pleasure of visiting the Hacienda Valdez in Desert Hot Springs, meeting the staff and learning about this facility. The length of rehabilitation is approximately 60 days. The center does help to get employment for these ladies when they are ready to be released and get out and support themselves. These ladies need our prayers for strength, as well. We visit this center between 4-6 weeks.

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE

OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE.

GIFT OF THE HEART KITS

At a recent "5:59 Gathering", Morella Larsen talked about her work with PDA (Presbyterian Disaster Assistance) and the Gift of the Heart kits. The kits contain supplies that are needed during times of need. The Mission Committee invites the congregation and friends to help in providing the following items needed to fill the kits.

School Kit

1 - pair blunt scissors

3 - 70 count spiral notebooks (no loose leaf or filler paper)

1 - 12" (30 cm) ruler

6 - new pencils with erasers

1 - hand-held pencil sharpener

1 - large eraser

1 - box of 24 crayons

1 - cloth bag, 12" x 14" to 14" x 17" finished size, cotton or lightweight canvas, cloth handles

Pack all items in the cloth bag.

Hygiene Kit

1 - hand towel (approx. 16" x 28")

1 - washcloth

1 - wide-tooth comb

1 - nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards)

1 - bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)

1 - toothbrush (in original packaging)

6—Band-aids

Please do not add toothpaste.

Toothpaste, which has an extended expiration

date will be added to Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment.

Seal all items in one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure.

You can bring a completed kit(s) or items from the lists and we will assemble the kits.



Requests were made by several of the ladies attending the Women's Retreat for the recipe of Pastor Bill's Key Lime Pie.

From Pastor Bill's Kitchen His Famous Key Lime Margarita Pie

1 and 1/4 cups crushed pretzels for crust (finally crushed) 8 3/4 to 9 inch pie pan 1/4 cup sugar

6 tbsp. butter, melted for crust

Mix together pretzels, sugar, and butter, form into 8 3/4 or 9 inch pie pan and place in refrigerator while preparing rest of pie.

1 can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk 1/2 cup lime (or lemon) juice ~~ I use 2/3 regular limes and 1/3 key limes with, if you wish, 1 jigger plus or minus of Tequila ~~ for a total of 1/2 cup. I will also add lime zest - a tbsp or so just for flavor and looks.

- 1 envelope Kool-aid Lemon-lime (or just lemon if making lemon pie), unsweetened soft drink mix.
- 1 tub (8 oz) Cool Whip whipped topping thawed and softened

Mix condensed milk, lime juice and Cool Whip and then add Kool-aid until well mixed. Pour into pretzel piecrust and place in freezer for at least 6 hours or overnight. Remove from freezer 30 minutes before serving; dip pie pan into hot water for 20-30 seconds to make easier to remove.

Makes 10 small or 6 large servings. Enjoy!!
