A Message From Our Minister

This is the message that went in the Yellow Pages of the weekly bulletin after the passage of Amendment 10-A. We are reprinting it here for those of you who are away.

Brothers & Sisters in Christ;

With the passing of Amendment 10A on May 10, 2011, many will have questions about what this means in the life of our church. I offer these words from General Assembly: "This decision begins with the unequivocal affirmation that ordained office will continue to be rooted in each deacon, elder and minister's 'joyful submission to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life.'"

This decision confirms the authority of tenets found in our Book of Confession and returns our church to it's roots – The Living Word, a single body with many gifts, called to service, with Christ as it's head.

Palm Springs Presbyterian is a church of "open hearts and open minds", and our focus on God's generous love is a great strength. Let us continue to affirm our belief that all are beloved by God and have much to give in service. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to call.

The following is an e-mail that was received from The Rev. Dr. Anita Hendrix, Executive Presbyter:

Dear Colleagues in Ministry,

The whole Presbyterian Church, USA is grappling with the consequences of the passage of Amendment 10-A. While some of our pastors and members are pleased with its passage, others are deeply grieved by it. Some conversations have been occurring among like-minded people, and some presbytery committees have made time for members to listen to and talk with one another. In coming to terms with our future as a Presbytery, the Council Cabinet believes it would be helpful for folks in the Presbytery to listen to one another and pray together. Two opportunities are planned, in the hopes that as many pastors and members as possible can participate in a listening session. The Rev. Ralph Mueller and I will facilitate the conversations. The information for these listening sessions is as follows:

Wednesday, June 22 at Palm Springs Church 11:30 – 1:30 p.m. (Please bring a bag lunch. Beverages and dessert will be provided.)


He knew we needed a church and when the right opportunity came up, God, working through this church, and some key individuals, made this possible.

From Jim DeHart's Kitchen Chewy Pecan Pie Bars

1/4 cup melted butter or margarine

- 2 cups packed brown sugar
- 2/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 4 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups chopped pecans confectioners' sugar

Pour butter into a 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in, baking pan; set aside.

In a mixing bowl, combine brown sugar, flour, eggs, vanilla, baking soda and salt; mix well. Stir in pecans. Spread over butter.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes. Remove from the oven; immediately dust with confectioners' sugar. Cool before cutting.
