LITURGICAL COLORS

Colors are often used symbolically in the life of the church. Liturgical colors and the times at which they are sued are the result of traditions and popular usage.

White (and also gold) symbolize purity or joy. Used during the Christmas and Easter seasons and on high days during the Seasons After Epiphany and Pentecost.

Purple symbolizes either penitence or royalty. Used during Advent and Lent.

Red, as a symbol of the Holy Spirit, is used on the Day of Pentecost and at other times during the year when the Holy Spirit is emphasized.

Green symbolizes growth. Used in the Seasons After Epiphany and After Pentecost except when while or red are required for special days.

CANDLES

Candles symbolize Jesus Christ, the Light of the world. When one candle appears on each side of the altar the two natures of Christ, divine and human, are emphasized.

From Kate Walker's Kitchen Vegetable Barley Soup

½ lb lean ground beef
1 medium chopped onion
1 clove garlic, minced
7 cups water
1 14 ½ oz can chopped tomatoes
½ cup barley
1 cup each sliced carrots & celery
2 beef bullion cubes
½ tsp basil & 1 bay leaf
1 9oz pkg frozen mixed vegetables

Brown meat. Add onions & garlic. Cook till tender. In a 4-qt pan or Dutch oven, mix remaining ingredients except frozen vegetables. Add cooked meat mix. Cover bring to a boil. Reduce heat & simmer 60 mins, stirring occasionally. Add frozen vegetables and cook 10 mins or till tender.
