Also present were Anne Smith, representing the Committee of Ministry (COM) and newly elected Elders Susan McGuire and Don Shepherd.

Session approved having a retreat in March for the Elders and Deacons along with assignment of committee chairmen. Installation & ordination of new Elders & Deacons approved for Sunday, February 5th. CILANTED CEATED


