As we enter the season of Lent, and begin our Easter walk, it is good to remember how blessed we are, and how challenged, too. Just before the quote above, Jesus gives notice to the Pharisees, who question his authority following the healing of a blind man: "I have come into this world so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind." The Pharisees, who think they know it all, can't accept that Jesus is the Way, and refuse to surrender their authority for the revelation that stands before them. Even as we stand at the beginning of this Easter walk, are we fully prepared to accept the responsibilities that come with the joy of the Resurrection? Are we prepared to 'surrender?' To accept - and give - the unconditional love demonstrated in the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ?

That can sound sort of heavy, but really, it is as light as a feather! While Christmas is filled with song and joy and gifts and truly a wonderful celebration of Jesus' birth, what can match the wonder of the Cross? Every year around this time, I start to feel younger and younger as Easter approaches. By the time we reach Palm Sunday, I often wish I could walk down an aisle with children, waving a palm frond; and on Easter Sunday, with rows of lilies, the bright yellow of daffodils, colored eggs and those wondrous words: "He is Risen, Risen, Indeed!', my heart belies my body and I am once again that child of innocence, totally invested in the glory of the day.

This is surrender: to our trust, and our faith, to God; to the love of Christ and the reason we gather to worship and give thanks every Sunday, and strive to carry our better selves into the world throughout the weeks, months, years. Easter! Rebirth and new beginnings! We don't need to carry our burdens of sorrow, but can instead put on coats of light! We are not bound by Law, but by Love.

Embrace this time, set aside for contemplation, sacrifice, and remembering. That long, long ago, Jesus faced all the woes we encounter, and more. Visualize the details: a group of rag-tag vagabonds, often trailed by camp followers, likely watched by authorities,' led by a charismatic man who was more than a prophet and heading towards a martyr's death with full knowledge of the suffering he would endure. The Hope of the world in dusty sandals, God with us, who never faltered and through whom we, everyday people, would gain reunion with our Creator, forgiveness, everlasting life.

Come, let us walk together, as little children, until we arrive at the foot of the Cross


Save used ink cartridges for Palm Springs High School Band fundraiser. Collection jar is on Jackie's desk.

LEMON BARS

Mix together ¹/₂ c butter softened 1 c flour ¹/₄ c powdered sugar Mix well. Put in 8 x 8 buttered pan. Bake 350 degrees 15 minutes.


Meanwhile as first mixture bakes Mix together 2 eggs beaten 2 Tbsp lemon juice 1 c sugar 2 Tbsp flour ½ t baking powder Mix well and spread on top of first mixture. Bake 25 minutes 350 degrees. Cool. Dust with powdered sugar.


