Ah, September, and the mercury is falling into the double digits! Hooray for Autumn! Returning to the desert after a vacation in the verdant green of the Northwest always poses an initial challenge of readjustment, as the memory of big trees and bodies of water tugs at the senses. Well, at least until that first giant moon rises into



a clear night sky and I fall asleep knowing the morning will bring another guaranteed day of sunshine.

This summer vacation was a little different, though. What would normally seem a blessing - day after cloudless day in an infamously wet city - became a bane as smoke from the half of the state that was on fire blew over the mountains and filled the air with choking poison. We grow used to creation being tamed and accessible, and it can come as a sobering surprise when it becomes a source of pain and fear. So much is taken for granted.

And so, in this summer of Western wildfires, we might recognize the *power* that dwells all around us, and our vulnerability, even if distanced from nature's trend to surprise, challenge and destroy. We can be reminded that in every minute of every day, we should give thanks to the God of creation; in our faith we can understand the beauty and hope that rises in the ashes left behind.

Hurricane Katrina blew through the gulf states ten years ago; today, the recovery of cities like New Orleans demonstrate the human spirit's ability to rise again. And from the fires that burn thousands of acres, scrub trees and bushes will push through the black earth, bringing color and life to barrenness, even as lost homes reappear on ridges and in valleys. For God breathes life even into death, and lifts up the hopeless to a place of hopefulness.

The world, in its violence and resistance to a meaningful peace, is like the fire, like the hurricane. Whether individual to individual or nation to nation, the lack of civility creates a landscape that is as lifeless as any left behind by fire or water; we who are left must learn to stand together on this scarred, hallowed ground and praise nothing but God; for without the strength of that love we are given, that love that can't be ground under the heel of hate, what we know or hope to know will blow away like grains of sand. We who witness violence, like the victims of natural disaster, must reclaim life from the scourge of desolation and hopelessness.

We must demonstrate our better side no matter now far we are removed from any disaster, and disaster includes the maladies of hate, violence, and disregard for human life. Each of us has a God-given gift to heal, reconcile, and above all, Love.

As we stand on the cusp of Fall, and the beginning of the Winter season in our desert valley, let us approach this coming time of reunion, community and joy with an added sense of purpose, Call and relationship. Each of us has a gift. Let's join hands and make a difference, as God's people, in a reluctant and petulant world.

PARTICIPANT REGISTRATION FOR THE NEW TERM BEGINS SEPTEMBER 1, 2015.


- Participants are required to register or re-register for the new term at www.ralphs.com or by using the scanbar letter at the register starting September 1, 2015.

- If you would like to receive a scanbar letter, please respond to this email and one will be emailed to you. Contact the PSPC office for the e-mail address.
- 5 Even if your participants registered as recently as June, July or August 2015, they are required to register again, on or after **September 1, 2015**.
- 6 Your organization does NOT need to re-register, only your participants.
- 7 This notice does not apply to participants of the Food 4 Less/Foods Co Community Rewards program.


